Quality Care Matters

- Children's brains grow quickly during their first years of life and their experiences during these critical early years is what lays the foundation for the rest of their lives.
- Through play, children learn to take the perspective of another. They learn self-control and the ability to take turns, negotiate, compromise, and work out conflicts. These are essential behaviors that help children succeed in school and throughout life.
- A positive adult-child relationship built on trust, understanding, and caring will foster children's cooperation, motivation, and increase their positive outcomes both at home and at school.

Indicators of Quality Care

- Staff are CPR/First Aid and Health and Safety certified
- Staff are screened for any criminal background
- Facility is licensed and regulated by the state
- Facility is clean and safe
- Staff communicate often and support parent involvement
- Staff have ongoing professional training
- Staff have education specialized in working with children
- Low adult to child ratio/appropriate group sizes
- Developmentally appropriate curriculum
- School readiness/educational experiences
- Support for social-emotional development

Child Care & Development Selections for Educational Experiences for Madera County

Families can mix and match early educational programs. For example, a child may attend a part-day program and receive wrap-around care through a Licensed Child Care Center (CCC), Family Child Care Home (FCCH), or Licensed-Exempt Care (Family, Friend or Neighbor)

CENTER BASED

State Funded Programs (Title 5)

- Services offered: comprehensive educational experiences, meals, health screenings. Staff screened for any criminal background and are CPR/First Aid certified
- Eligibility: children in families with incomes below the 70% SMI poverty

Full Day State Preschool (FDSP)

- Hours of Operation: include full day sessions
- Ages served: 3-4 yrs
- **Need:** Parents are required to be working, attending school/training, seeking employment or incapacitated

Part Day State Preschool (PDSP)

- Hours of Operation: 3-4 hour morning or afternoon sessions
- Ages served: 18 months 4 years or 3 4 years, depends on program

Federally Funded Programs

Madera/Mariposa Regional Head Start

Madera /Merced/ Seasonal Migrant Head Start

- Services offered: Comprehensive early childhood education, medical & dental screening, services to children with disabilities, social skills, nutrition and family support services. Home-base services offered in Madera County.
- **Eligibility:** Children in families with incomes below the federal poverty guidelines. Migrant eligible when more than 50% of income from agriculture and have moved in the last 24 months in search of an agriculture related job.
- Hours of Operation: Regional provides part-time 3.5 hours morning or afternoon or full day session depending on the center. Migrant provides full day sessions.
- Days & months of operation vary: School Year or Seasonal
- Ages served: Regional Head Start (3-5 yrs.) Migrant Head Start (6wks-5 yrs.)
- Priority: Based on income, age and disability

Families who do not qualify for any federal or state subsidized programs have private pay options through a Child Care Center (CCC), Family Child Care Home (FCCH), or License-Exempt Care (Family, Friend or Neighbor).

VOUCHER BASED

State/Federal Funded Program

Allows parents to choose among child care providers in their communities

Child Care Alternative Payment Program (APP)

- Ages served: 0-12 yrs
- Eligibility: children in families with income below 70% SMI guidelines
 - CalWORKS Stage 2 & 3 Parent currently or recently received cash aid
 - General APP enrolled from subsidized program eligibility list by rank
- Need: Parents are required to be working, attending school/training, seeking employment or incapacitated

Migrant Child Care Alternative Payment Program (CMAP):

• Services available to children of migrant agricultural workers

CHILD CARE OPTIONS:

Child Care Center

- Licensed by the state of California
- Staff screened for any criminal background
- Staff CPR/First Aid and Health & Safety certified
- Educational experiences
- May offer nutritious meals/snacks and transportation may be available
- Hours of operation: full-time or part-time care

Family Child Care Home

- Licensed by the state of California
- Staff screened for criminal background clearance
- Staff are CPR/First Aid, Health & Safety certified
- Home-based educational experiences
- May offer nutritious meals/snacks and/or transportation may be available
- Hours of operation: full or part day and may include non traditional hours (nights and weekends)

License-Exempt Care (Family, Friend or Neighbor)

- Not a licensed home (can only care for children from one non-related family)
- Home-based care
- Hours of operation are flexible (nights and weekends)
- Criminal background clearance may be required
