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Active Supervision Tips



Create a daily classroom schedule

for the children and teachers to follow. This helps to keep the day predictable for all members of the classroom community.

Create a zoning chart

that specifies which teacher is in charge of which area/activity, as well as what individual duties are during the transition before and after the activity. Zoning allows every member of the team to be accountable and informed.

Position your body

so you are always able to see the children. If you are on your knees in the classroom, be sure you can see over the shelving units so that you are aware of the children's whereabouts at all times.

Scan your assigned area

and the rest of the classroom at all times. This allows staff members to be constantly aware of what is happening in the classroom.

Talk to the other staff members

in the classroom throughout the day to highlight positive behaviors that you are seeing as well as, address any issues that may arise. "Teacher Teri, I need to help Oscar wash his hands, can you cover my areas?"
